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About the conference

Once accepted, the corresponding authors will be informed about the same. Subsequently, the full paper should be submitted through a link which will be shared in the confirmation email.

The full paper should be prepared as a word file. The paper should be restricted to 2500 words. Tables, figures and images, if any, should have appropriate captions and be of good quality. Proper citations and corresponding references should be given.

Accepted papers will be published in the conference proceedings. Registration is compulsory for paper presentation and subsequent publication in the conference proceedings.
