

♣ PRAGJYOTISH COLLEGE:A BRIEF HISTORICAL BACKGROUND



Pragjyotish College, established on 1st September 1954, seven years after Independence, became a beacon of learning and a symbol of aspirations for the common people of Assam, raring to build a new nation. Pandit Tirthanath Sarma, eminent scholar and litterateur, responded to and actively participated in the nation building by taking charge as the founder Principal of Pragjyotish College. From its modest inception as an arts college, Pragjyotish College has now developed into one of the premier institutions of higher education in Guwahati. At present, it is a well-known full-fledged under-graduate college imparting higher education in multiple streams.

Situated on the western bank of the Bharalu, a rivulet, in the western part of Guwahati, Pragjyotish College is about 1 kilometre away from its confluence with the mighty Brahmaputra. It is about 4 kilometres from the Guwahati Railway Station and at a distance of about 20 kilometres from the Lokapriya Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport. At the backdrop of the college is a beautiful panoramic view of Nilachal Hills, the famous abode of Mother Goddess Kamakhya.

In the emblem of the college, is ingrained the motto "तेजस्विनावधीतमस्तु" (May our study make us illumined) and a conch shell at the centre on an eight-petalled full-blown beautiful-lotus, which symbolizes pure knowledge and the relationship between the teacher and the learner, praying to the Almighty for energy, protection, maintenance that ultimately leads to peace and bliss.

In its glorious existence of six decades, Pragjyotish College, as *alma mater*, has produced a galaxy of eminent personalities in all walks of life. The college celebrated its Diamond Jubilee Year during 2013–14.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR ADMISSION

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Use **ONLY** your personal and active Mobile Number, WhatsApp Number and Gmail address wherever needed during the process of ONLINE FORM SUBMISSION. ONLY these will be used for any communication to you from Admission to the end of your study in Pragjyotish College.
- 2. Please download a suitable mobile scanner (preferably KAAGAZ Scanner) to scan and make a pdf copy of your documents like Mark sheet, Proof of your Age, Domicile Certificate, Caste Certificate, Passport size photo, signature, Proper Gap Certificate (EITHER a certificate from the Head of the institution last attended in his/her official letter pad with Seal and Signature OR an affidavit from the NOTARY) etc. Please save all documents with BLACK & WHITE filter. Before saving a document in the scanner, drag the margin line to the actual position of your document.
- 3. Your application may be REJECTED if any factual discrepancy found during verification process.
- 4. You must be able to pay fees, if applicable, online through NEFT/mobile banking etc. Without clearing your dues, you will not be allowed to get admission.

A **confirmation message** for Provisional Admission will be sent to your **WhatsApp number** and Gmail address on the **date of admission**. This will **remain active** ONLY for **24 hours** and you MUST have to RESPOND accordingly within 24 hours. After that your selection will automatically be cancelled.



4 GENERAL INFORMATION FOR ADMISSION

Admission to all programs is governed by the College Admission Rules which strictly maintains the order of merit of the students. All decisions of the Admission Committee for 2021-22 Session, regarding admission to different programs will be final and binding.

- **College Prospectus:** College Prospectus will be available in the college website and can be downloaded **FREE** of cost. College Prospectus/ Admission Forms in **hard copy** format will **NOT** be issued from the college office.
- Admission Procedure: Admission to different programs will be held ONLINE on the date of admission (to be notified in our website). After online submission of forms, admission to FIRST SEMESTER/Year classes in 2021-22 academic session will be held in FIVE stages:

STAGE I

(a) For TDC Classes: Publication of Subject-wise merit list in the website

(b) For HS Classes: Publication of general merit list in the website

STAGE II

- **(a) For TDC Classes:** According to the availability of seat and maintaining the list of merit, message containing confirmation of seat (provisional) for each subject/program one have applied, will be sent to candidate's PERSONAL and ACTIVE Whatsapp Number and Gmail address, which will remain active ONLY for 24 hours. This process will continue till all the seats in respective subjects/programs are filled
- **(b) For HS Classes:** Same procedure will be followed for admission to HS classes. But the candidates will receive message for the program only.

STAGE III_According to his/her choice, a candidate MUST have to respond to the offer sent, within 24 hours. If not responded, his/her candidature will automatically be cancelled after 24 hours. No claim for the seat will be entertained by the authority.

STAGE IV Process for the Payment of fees, if applicable for a certain candidate, to be completed immediately through online payment portal of Pragjyotish College, after receiving the confirmation message

STAGE V The candidate will get a formal confirmation message with his/her roll number after final verification by the admission committee

- **Filling up of Online Admission Forms:** All candidates will have to fill up the Admission Forms through **ONLINE MODE ONLY** through the link provided in the college website [www.pragjyotishcollege.ac.in] on or before the stipulated dates mentioned in the Admission Notice
- Online Document Upload: Candidates will have to upload SCANNED COPIES of relevant documents, photographs, signatures, etc. as instructed
- **Gap Certificate:** To be provided by candidates whose year of passing the qualifying exam is not the current year, i.e. 2021. Gap Certificates (if necessary) must be either from the Head of the Institution last attended or in the form of an Affidavit from any Hon'ble Court of Law. Gaps of more than 3 (Three Years) shall NOT be considered for admission in any of the programs. Medical Certificates will NOT be accepted in lieu of gap certificates.
- Domicile Certificate (only by candidates whose State of Domicile is ASSAM): Any one of the following documents must be provided –
- 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE CERTIFICATE (PRC)
- 2. **VOTER IDENTITY CARD** of self or parent
- 3. **AADHAR CARD** of self or parent
- 4. **BPL CARD** of family
- 5. **PASSPORT** of self or parent

Subject Selection:

- (i) (For B.A./B.Sc.): Candidates are allowed to apply in 3 (three) subjects as honors. With each selection they must mention their preference (2 in numbers) for generic subject.
- (ii) (For H.S): Specific subject restrictions must be followed

Subject Combinations allotted according to the choice of the candidate at the time of admission will NOT be changed later

- **Payment of Admission Fees:** Fees to be paid online through payment gateway of Pragjyotish College
- **Verification of Original Documents:** All original documents related to admission purpose will have to be produced by the admitted students as and when asked for by the college authorities

Reservation against Extra-curricular Activities: For admission against this category, a candidate should upload testimonial to establish that he/ she have participated in any sports/ games/ cultural etc. event not below State level.

Standardization of Marks: To standardize the marks obtained by candidates of various boards, the Admission Committee shall follow the following procedure for preparing merit lists in various programs:

B.A./ B.Sc. Programs:

- A) Aggregate marks obtained (excluding Physical Education/ Entrepreneurship/ Vocational**subjects) in the 12th standard examination.
- B) Marks of best THREE (03) subjects in descending order (For_B.Sc. program candidates must not enter the marks of English and MIL even if they scored better than elective subjects)
- C) Total Marks of the subject in which he/she desires to take honors.

HS (Arts/Science) Programs:

- (A) Aggregate marks obtained in the 10th standard examination.
- (B) Marks of best THREE (03) subjects in descending order

Self-sustained Programs:

(a) B.Sc. (Computer Science)/BCA /BBA/ B.Com.):

- **A. ATTENDANCE RULES:** All students on roll should attend at least 75% of the classes held in each subject to become eligible for appearing in the Council/ University examinations. Students not fulfilling the above requirement will not be allowed to appear in the final/ term-end examinations.
- **B. COLLEGE UNIFORM:** Wearing of the college uniform is compulsory for all students for all purposes during their stay inside the college campus.

H.S. and U.G. Programs:

For Boys: Satin blue shirt decorated with the college emblem and blackish blue trousers, black shoes, white socks and blue blazer/sweater (V-shaped white stripe). Jeans trousers and shirts are not permitted. The design and style of the uniform must be formal.

For Girls: Formal *kurta* of blackish blue thin stripes on off-white colour decorated with the college emblem and blackish blue *churidar*, and navy blue *dupatta* and navy blue sweater decorated with the college emblem. The design and style of the uniform must be formal.

T-shirts and jeans trousers (designed by any department) are not allowed in the classroom and on the college premises.

- **C. MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE:** The students must observe complete silence within the college premises. They must not loiter aimlessly within the college campus. Students must spend their spare time/off periods in such a way that will not cause any interference with the work of others. Use of cell phones for conversation is strictly prohibited inside the classrooms/ laboratories/verandahs/ building passages. Students can use the cell phones only in the designated areas like student common rooms, canteen, etc. Students found to violate this statutory instruction are liable to face disciplinary action including the seizure of the cell phones.
- **D. NOTICE BOARDS AND INSTITUTIONAL PORTAL:** Students should, in their own interest, read all the notices displayed on the departmental notice boards, office notice boards, Digital Notice Board and other display boards frequently, for remaining fully aware of the latest information displayed thereon. Students are also advised to browse the institutional website (**www.pragjyotishcollege.ac.in**) for various notices and updates.
- **E. RAGGING:** Ragging is a punishable offence under the Indian Penal Code (IPC). The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has ordered all universities and their affiliated colleges under the University Grants Commission (U.G.C.) that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the students involved in ragging shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the institution (UGC letter No. F.1-8/2006 (CPP- II) February, 2008).**RAGGING** of newly admitted students is **STRICTLY PROHIBITED** and shall be dealt with a firm hand, under the existing penal provisions. **If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the college authority, the student (s) involved in ragging shall be given liberty to put forward his/ her explanation, which if not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/ her from the college. Instances of violent incidents incurring grievous injuries and loss of life and property will be reported to the police.**
- **F. STUDENTS' IDENTITY CARD:** Every student is issued an identity card after admission. student in the unit tests/sessional examinations, class attendance, etc. Internal Assessments will be done taking into account of the students' attendance, assignments, seminar presentations, performance in the unit tests/sessional examinations.

CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

In addition to the prescribed courses of study, the college encourages and motivates the students to organize and actively participate in various co-curricular activities such as games and sports, drama, finearts, literary and cultural activities, debating, symposium, and so on from time to time.

- **BRIDGE COURSES/ ORIENTATION PROGRAMS:** At the beginning of new academic session, several departments organizes introductory sessions in the form of bridge courses for the newly admitted students, not only for giving them a broad overview of the institution, but also to help them understand the curriculum and broad perspectives of the subject they will be required to study in the next few semesters. The PTNS Library of the college organizes library orientation programs for making the newly admitted students acquainted with the library facilities, provisions and other rules/ regulations.
- **CULTURAL ACTIVITIES:** Various cultural activities are held inside the college campus at different times of the year. Cultural programs are organized in every department on the occasion of departmental freshman social and farewell functions, while a wide spectrum of other such programs are held during the annual College Freshman Social event and the Annual College Week. Activities like folk dance, modern dance, one act plays, street plays, group songs, solo songs etc. are performed in the college campus on various occasions like Annual College Week Festival, Foundation Day, etc. Faculty members of the Performing Arts Department coordinate most of the cultural activities, with logistic support of the PCSU secretary in-charge of cultural affairs.
- **EDUCATIONAL EXCURSIONS, FIELD WORKS AND INSTITUTIONAL VISITS:** Several departments organize these programs and activities for the students. For some subjects, these activities form part of the co-curricular activities. Faculty members from respective departments accompany the student groups during such programs.
- **EXTENSION AND OUTREACH ACTIVITIES:** In order to develop social aptitude of the students, various extension education programs are organized from time to timein the fringe areas of the

institution. These activities are primarily facilitated, coordinated and monitored by the Extension Education Advisory Committee.

- **GAMES AND SPORTS:** The college provide facilities for games like volleyball, badminton, table tennis, carom, chess, etc. There are separate PCSU office bearers for general sports, minor sports, cricket and gymnasium. The indoor games are mostly held within the college campus while some of the outdoor games like kabaddi, football, cricket etc. are played in the Sonaram H.S. School playground. A MoU has been executed with Sonaram Higher Secondary School in this regard. A well-equipped Sports Library has been recently set up, for stock piling various sports equipment. A basket-ball court of size 27.7 metres x 12.70 metres has been developed inside the college campus. A wide range of games and sport events are held during the Annual College Week, under active coordination of PCSU. Students also participate in various other similar events organized by external agencies outside the college campus from time to time. Students are encouraged to participate in collegiate, inter-collegiate, inter-zonal, inter-university, state, national and international level competitions.
- **HEALTH CARE ACTIVITIES:** The college provide amenities for health well-being of the students and staff. A gymnasium hub with modern infrastructural provisions was set up in 2016 under RUSA grants. It caters to the physical well-being issues where membership is also provided to the residents of fringe localities at competitive fees. The **Gymnasium Hub** is under the supervision of a Gymnasium Instructor, who is in charge of collection of member subscription amounts as well as providing workouts instructions to all users. Provision has also been made for yoga classes by experienced instructors, at reasonable fees. Provision for availing martial arts training in the evening hours also exists for the interested students.
- **HOME ASSIGNMENTS AND STUDENT SEMINARS:** Students of several departments are required to submit home assignments and participate in student seminars on topics that are allotted from the syllabus of the concerned semester in which a student is studying.
- **INSTITUTIONAL BIO-TECH HUB:** An Institutional level Bio-tech Hub (IBT-hub) was established in the college in the year 2013 with some sophisticated instruments and apparatus necessary for enhancing hands-on-training skill and to make teaching/learning Biology/Biotechnology/Bioinformatics/Biochemistry etc. more attractive. The IBT-hub was sponsored by DBT, Govt. of India through BCIL and managed by North-East Biotechnology Programme Management Cell.
- LANGUAGE LABORATORY: One of the latest additions is the Language Laboratory which has come into existence in 2017 to meet the growing demands of students who are keen to develop their speaking skills, soft skills and personality. Set up on the second floor of the C-Block, the language laboratory includes a hall and a studio-cum-observation room. The air-conditioned laboratory is equipped with 15 multi-media computer sets (provided by RUSA) with headphones. Six language departments viz. Assamese, Bengali, Bodo, English, Hindi and Sanskrit share this laboratory. Each department is free to design and conduct crash courses for improving the language skills, particularly the speaking skills of the students. Moreover, the language departments have plans to jointly conduct some programs and workshops on translation studies.

PANDIT TIRTHANATH SARMA LIBRARY

History: The PTNS Library was established in 1954 by Pandit Tirthanath Sarma, the founder principal and an eminent scholar, in a tiny room attached to his office at Sonaram H.S. School with a modest collection of about 150 books. In 1963, the library was run in one room with a collection of 700 books. The library developed continuously and it was shifted to its own permanent building in 1991. At that time, the library collection was nearly 35,000 books. The college library was named after Pandit Tirthanath Sarma on February 24, 1995. Since its inception, the college library is striving for providing maximum support to the students as well as teachers in the teaching learning process. The library is very rich in terms of collection of Assamese and Sanskrit Literature. Presently, the library is running with Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) Technology. The library is linked up with INFLIBNET. Besides other modern services, the Pandit Tirthanath Sarma Library provides access to e-journals facilities to its users through the program entitled National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST) under National Mission on Education. The entire first floor of the library building is presently running on solar power system.

Library Timings: The library remains open in all working days. Even during summer and winter breaks, the library remains open.

Book Issue Timings: 10:00 am-4:00 pm

Library Membership: Library membership is given to all students, teachers, and other staff of the college only.

Library Cards: Smart Library Cards are provided to all the members of the library. These cards are mandatory to enter the library. The digital attendance system of the library also operates with the smart library cards. Students can borrow and return library books through the self-service kiosks by using these smart library cards.

U.G. students having Major/Honours subjects can borrow **four** books at a time.

U.G. students of general course can borrow **two** books at a time.

H.S., B.B.A., B.C.A., M.A., M.Sc. and M.T.M. students can borrow two books at a time.

Book Bank: A book bank, sponsored and financed by the UGC has been maintained by the college since 1971. Poor and meritorious students are provided with books from the book bank for a complete academic session.

Reading Room cum Reference Section: The library has a spacious and well-equipped modern reading room accommodating about 72 students and a separate reading corner for teachers. Newspapers and periodicals are displayed in the reading room. Journals, magazines, periodicals and reference books are issued for use inside the reading room only. The library has a very good collection of dictionaries and encyclopaedias in the reference section.

Special Service: The library has a United Nations Library Corner which contains lots of valuable and rare publications of UNESCO, WHO, etc. There are two reference corners in the library – North East India reference corner and Pandit Tirthanath Sarma reference corner, for advance learners. The family of Late Pandit Tirthanath Sarma donated his valuable collection of books to the library. Maximum books of this collection pertain to Sanskrit and English literature. In this collection, a lot of rare and old books are available, which caters to the needs of learners with special interests. The library has a good collection of books for career guidance. The library is very rich in reference books viz. encyclopaedias, dictionaries, bound periodicals, record books, atlases, handbooks, etc.

Facilities: The department has a small library with a modest collection of books, journals and bulletins for partial catering to the needs of the students. Laboratory equipment such as original tools of the Prehistoric period; models and original human bones for anatomical study; Dermatoglyphic equipment; Serological (Blood grouping) equipment; different instruments are available in the department for taking anthropometric measurements. 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Facilities: There is a departmental library for the students. Three computer sets, one LCD projector and one smart classroom are available. Laboratory is equipped with some basic instruments for performing general chemical analyses. UV-visible spectrophotometer has been purchased (under RUSA scheme) through which advanced physicochemical characteristics can be done.

Facilities: Major students are lent books from the departmental library, which has a collection of 447 books and journals. The students are allowed access to the departmental computers and internet facilities. Internet access is given to the students to make them aware about the digital library and its use. Students are given membership of the *Economic Planning Forum*, established in 1964, through which co-curricular/ extra-curricular activities are conducted. The department has a smart class room constructed from fund provided by RUSA. M.A. /M.Sc. programs (self-sustaining mode) have been introduced in the department from the academic session 2018–19 and already the 1st batch of the post graduate students have passed out with 4 (four) first class holders. The department also has a research laboratory.

Activities: Activities of the department, like memorial lectures, study tours, socio-economic surveys, popular talks outreach programme and plant visits (both for the under graduate and post graduate students) etc. are conducted under the aegis of the Economic Planning Forum. The department annually organizes *Bhabananda Deka Memorial Lecture*. Late Deka, a founder teacher of the department and the third Principal of the college, was a pioneer in writing books on economics in Assamese. The 11th *Bhabananda Deka Memorial Lecture was delivered by Dr. Gautam Mazumdar, Associate Professor, Cotton University on the topic "ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES OF NORTH EAST INDIA" organized on 29th <i>December 2020* and very recently, Dr. Susmita Priyadarshini, Associate Professor, Department of Economics, Devicharan Barua College, Jorhat, Assam delivered the 12th Bhabananda Deka Memorial Lecture on the topic "WILL NORTH EAST REGION LEAD THE GROWTH STORY OF INDIA?" on June 16, 2021 in virtual platform. Students and parents are encouraged to interact with the faculty members of the department. One parent-teacher meet is held per semester. The department is actively associated with SAESM (South Asian Economics Students Meet) from inception since 2004. The annual SAESM is a conference of undergraduate students majoring in economics in different colleges and institutions across South Asia.

Achievements: The department completed a consultancy project of Department of Veterinary Science, Govt. of Assam on *Dairy Farming and Dairy Co-operative Societies (DCS) under Bajali Development Block, Barpeta, Assam* in 2013–14. It organized a UGC-sponsored National Seminar on *Role of NGOs in Economic Development with Special Reference to the North East Economy* in September, 2013. The seminar deliberation was published as an edited volume (ISBN: 978-81-7213-229-3) and released on 1st September, 2014. The departmental labs are equipped with all necessary tools such as maps, topographical sheets, mirror stereoscopes, prismatic compasses, dumpy levels, theodolites and other instruments. The departmental library possesses more than 500 reference books along with a well-furnished reading room. To encourage the writing skills of the students, the department has introduced two wall magazines, namely *GLOBAL VILLAGE* and *GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SERVICE*. The department has a smart class room set up through funds obtained from RUSA. The department has been upgraded to a Post Graduate

Department in 2021. The department has also successfully conducted a *Certificate Course on Application of Geographic Information System and Remote Sensing* from 10th -15th August, 2020. The department is the nodal department for the Tourism Management Department of the college, which was started with initial financial assistance provided by UGC.

Activities: Apart from the regular teaching-learning process, departmental seminars are held every Saturdays where students of each class are required to present papers. The department arranges remedial classes for the students on demand. Field surveys/ works are organized both within and outside the State as per requirements of the syllabus. Every year on 26th of August, the department celebrates the Foundation Day of the *Pragjyotish College Geographical Society (PCGS)* and the departmental freshman's social. An annual newsletter *Prag Bhugol* is also released on this occasion, which presents the holistic summary of the departmental activities, students' achievement, special mentions, etc. Plans are afoot to hold national seminars in the near future. The department constantly insists upon a strong bonding with alumni fraternity as well as the guardians. Periodic meetings are arranged to elicit their views and suggestions for department uplift. Students from all the northeastern states flock to this department, which is showcased in various departmental activities.

Facilities: The departmental infrastructure and resources include departmental library, smart class-room, laboratories with a large stockpile of samples of rocks, minerals, fossils, petrological microscopes, ore microscopes, and other equipment like sieve- shaker, brunton and clinometer compass, portable-GPS, pocket stereoscopes, electronic weighing scales, surveying equipment, etc. Two computer sets with LCD projectors caters to various academic needs of the department.

Activities: Activities like presentation of seminar talks and home assignments on topics allocated from their respective syllabi in every semester are made compulsory for students of the Major/ Honours programs. Geological field works and institutional visits are carried out both within and outside the state, for students, in collaboration with various organizations like the Geological Survey of India, Directorate of Geology and Mining, Govt. of Assam, National Geophysical Research Institute, National Centre for Antarctic and Ocean Research, National Institute of Oceanography and various other reputed Universities from time to time. With a view to encourage and motivate students, subject experts as well as academicians are invited to deliver lectures on topics like geo-scientific issues, career-related issues etc. Special care, attention and guidance is given to students with respect to competitive exams and also for issues related to higher studies. An active departmental society entitled Geological Society of Pragjyotish College (GSoPC) has been formed on 10th March 2016 and under this banner some social activities like plantation drivés, cleanliness drives, trekking, invited talks, geological model exhibitions, poster competitions, quiz competitions, photography competitions, etc. are carried out occasionally. A departmental newsletter entitled Petrais published annually with collective efforts of teachers and students, the main objective of which is to highlight the year-long departmental activities and various achievements, both at departmental and individual levels. Students are involved in other extra-curricular activities like contribution to the departmental wall magazines Basundhara and Geopaedia, in addition to wall painting works in the department. Students also actively participate in periodical departmental cleaning programs, departmental library restoration works, museum reorganization works, etc. Faculty and student exchange programs were held during the last academic session vide two major MoUs that were signed with Dimoria College and AryaVidyapeeth College.
