The curriculum planning and implementation is done by the parent university and the college follows the curriculum provided by the university. Different departments of the college prepare Lesson Plans according to the syllabus for justified implementation of the curriculum. These plans include total number of classes, total number of actual working days and the remarks for unattended classes. Courses are completed within the academic session. The college arranges class tests/ internal assessments and sessional examination for continuous evaluation. Some departments also conduct student seminars. Some of the departments assign project work/field visit on different topics as per the curriculum. Necessary viva-voce examinations are conducted in different departments of the college to evaluate projects of the students. Confidential examination records are kept in the custody of the examination committee for future references. Evaluated

answer scripts of sessional examinations are shown to the students and discussions done on their mistakes for better performances. Study materials are also provided to the students for their preparation in the examination. Student mentoring is being provided in some departments in an informal manner.

2.5.2 Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

Reforms as continuous internal evaluation has been initiated by the parent university i.e. Gauhati University. After proper evaluation of answer scripts of sessional examination, concerned teachers of the department show evaluated answer scripts to the students for their better performance. If any students fail to secure minimum passing marks or remain absent on the date of examination, the departments take outmost care to hold re-examination for them .Some of the departments have a good practice of conducting class tests, seminars, group discussions, as well as home assignments for the students which can be considered as a part of the CIE. This has been reflected in the analysis of student's feedback. About 34.05% and 38.11% students responded as good and very good in this regard. Again all the departments have provisions for tutorial class which has been allotted in the college routine. The purpose is to clarify the doubts and re-explain the critical topics and also discuss the question papers of the previously held examination. The departmental seminar and discussion is conducted for upgrading the oral skills of the students.

2.5.3 Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

Academic calendar serve as an information source and a planning document for students, faculty, staff and departments. The calendar includes an outline of both academic & non-academic activities which the institution intends to pursue in the current academic year. CRITERION VI: GOVERNANCE, LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT 6.1 Institutional Vision and Leadership

6.1.1 Mention two practices of decentralization and participative management during the last year (maximum 500 words)

- 1. The college authority uniformly decentralises various administrative as well as academic works among teaching and non-teaching staff on various occasions along with student representatives, wherever necessary. Besides, there are instances where the college authority encourages the involvement of student's guardian as member of the Governing Body of the college. As such two seats are reserved for the guardians in the GB of the college. Along with it there are members from the teaching staff, affiliated university and the local MLA.
- 2. Some other instances of involvement by college staff and students are summarised below:-

In each session, a general election is conducted for different portfolio of students union, which comprises of President, Vice President, General Secretary, secretary of minor and major game/ sports and boys' and girls' common rooms. The union body plays a very vital role in organising college week, Swaraswati Puja, publishing college magazine, participation in the college week and celebrating other national/ international days of important events under the guidance of their respective teacher-in-charge.

Many sub committees are constituted amongst the teaching staff for smooth functioning of the various internal affairs of the college. Some of committees organise many programs, high lighting different problems, current misuses related to student, teachers and neighbourhood. Some other committees help the authority for execution of plan programme of the college for realization of the goal. The GB has taken various steps for good governance in this year. These include certain strategic directives, plan and policies that integrate the college management system. Following faculty related decisions have been taken:-

1. F.D.P has been approved and granted leave to the teachers.

2. Associate, Selection Grade and Senior Scale of pay proposal approved and sent to DHE and Proposal for Govt. Concurrence for commerce stream has been sent to the DHE.

To strengthen the financial status of the college, decision has been taken to build a corpus fund of Rs 1.5 crore with U.B.I. and the decision has been executed immediately. For better management of the funds received from UGC, an UGC fund monitoring committee has been constituted. A Financial Advisory Committee was constituted earlier under the chairmanship of the Principal i/c. According to the recommendation of the committee fee structure for admission in new session and the salary of the guest faculties has been approved and implemented accordingly.

The GB also communicated with the DHE in filling up the vacant posts in different departments. Admission Committee, Routine Committee, PCSU election Committee etc. have been formed with efficient teachers for quality management in admission process, daily class schedule, student's participation in leadership building. Library Advisory Board has been re-constituted for better management and service to the users. Examination Committees have been formed to conduct and manage different examinations of Gauhati University, Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University and Institute of Distance and Open Learning. The IQAC has organized at least eight meetings with the stake holders for quality upgradation of the institution. These meetings include meeting with PCTU on May 13, 2014, meeting with HOD's on June 4, 2014, meeting with PCSU on June 6, 2014 and June 10, 2014, meeting with Library Staff on June 11,2 014. Certain social responsibility programmes have been initiated this year by the IQAC. Under this programme students of TTM visited Akshay Patra Foundation, Guwahati. The IQAC has also taken steps to introduce Yoga and Karate for the boarders of the Girls' Hostel.

6.2 Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following (within 100 words each):

<u>Curriculum Development:</u> The College is affiliated to Gauhati University and hence syllabus and curriculum are designed by the university (parent institution). All faculties from the college cannot take direct part in the syllabus design. However, in the academic meeting of the college, different issues related to syllabus are raised which are then passed on to a higher platform for further discussions. Nevertheless, teachers from different departments are member of the syllabus committee and takes active participation in the curriculum/syllabus development programme.

<u>Teaching and Learning:</u> The college has a general routine and every year it is reviewed by the routine committee for necessary modifications as per the available classrooms in consultation with the head of the departments. The HODs makes all the necessary rectification concerning the departmental activities. The college also makes provision in undertaking necessary projects, excursion, field works and visit to higher educational/research institutions. Many departments hold talks inviting academicians and experts from other higher institutions, picking up topics which are related to their subject to give the students different exposure other than normal classroom teaching. Departments like Geology, Zoology and Chemistry prepare hands on models, animated models and perform experiments on different topics relevant to syllabus and demonstrate the outcome for better understanding. Conduct departmental seminars are presented by the students assigned to them. <u>Examination And Evaluation:</u> All the final semester examinations are conducted in the college as per the University rules/direction and schedule, and the process of evaluation is done by designated zone of the university. Teachers are assigned as invigilator and examiner. Teachers from some departments are also appointed as external examiner in other colleges. Sessional examinations are conducted and evaluated in the College. The college is also one of the examination zonal centres for different streams and semesters of the university. All the teaching and non-teaching staff takes active part in the different examination and evaluation related works.

<u>Research And Development:</u> The college encourages research work in different streams and provide necessary infrastructure to carry out research work. Several faculty members have obtained Ph. D guide-ship in the parent University and in some other Govt/Private Universities and they are actively involved in research work. Many of the faculty members are engaged in minor and major research projects funded by various funding agencies viz. UGC, DST, DBT. The college has also a Bio-Tech hub attached to the department of Zoology which helps in enhancing research based knowledge of the students of life sciences as well as the faculty members. Research Committee of the college formulates the strategies for Research and Development of the College. College authority and the IQAC always encourage the faculty members to apply for Minor and Major Research Projects from various funding agencies. Several faculty members have availed FDP fellowship for pursuing Ph. D and completed in specified time and few others are still pursuing. Faculty members also publish research papers in various reputed journals including UGC listed journals and also presented papers etc.

Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation: For in-house operation, Library has been partially upgraded by using SOUL.20._OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogues) is developed in college library for collection and dissemination of information and knowledge._Internet facilities are provided in the library. Photocopy facilities are provided to the users. All the departments have departmental library with books relevant to their syllabus and subjects.

<u>Human Resource Management:</u> Discussions and meetings are conducted in a regular mode by the principal with the teaching and non-teaching staff for the smooth running of classes and other academic as well as administrative works. An academic officer has also been appointed to supervise the functioning of academic activities in the absence of the principal.

<u>Industry Interaction / Collaboration:</u> Department of Tourism Management has collaborated with the Sikkim Government in recruiting the students who have completed their master degrees from the College.

<u>Admission of Students:</u> The admission of students is done strictly on merit basis. The admission schedule is notified by means of banner and newspapers. Offline mode is available to apply for any course. The terms and conditions of the admission are clearly stated in the prospectus. Reservations for ST, SC, OBC and PWD are strictly maintained as per Assam Government rules. Admission committee formulate all the rules and regulations of the admission and prepares a central merit list. On the scheduled date admission takes place on first cum first serve basis as per the prepared merit list after the documents are verified. For Major students entrance tests are conducted by the respective Departments.

6.2.2 : Implementation of e-governance in areas of operations:

<u>Planning and Development</u>: The college is thrusting on e-tendering through the college website pertaining to different kinds of infrastructural development contract works.

Administration: Important communication to higher authorities is made through emails.

<u>Finance and Accounts</u>: The finance and accounts system of the college has already been computerised. A licenced version of Tally, accounting software is being operative since 2012.

Student Admission and Support: No significant developments

<u>Examination</u>: The internal assessment marks are assigned according to the scores obtained in various aspects viz. attendance, home assignments, seminars, class tests, etc. These marks are stored in computer database in some of the departments.

<u>Objectives of the Practice</u>: The goal of this programme is to attract students of the college to the community uplift issues

<u>The Context</u>: It is really a challenge to being students from various socio economic and other background to raise awareness for working towards community uplift. Keeping this in mind the college has taken an initiative to involve the students in different programs related to community uplift.

<u>The Practice</u>: The students of the college (primarily from the departments of Economics and Bengali) participated in different programs related to adoption of village schools in collaboration with 'Akshay Patra' (an NGO that provides midday meals to the students in school). Six members of IQAC visited the campus of 'Akshay Patra', Amingaon on 17/05/2014, to be acquainted with the views and functionality under an awareness programme initiated by the foundation.

<u>Evidence of Success</u>: Motivated by such a healthy practice, few students of our college participated in different NGO's, one such NGO being ASWAS, an NGO working in the field for education of orphaned children.

<u>Problems Encountered and Resources Required</u>: The college despite its good will to support such noble causes raised by different NGO's has not been able to do justice to such causes due to busy schedule of the students and teaching fraternity. With the introduction of semester system which is a time bounded system, the teachers and students hardly get time to devote whole heartedly to such causes. The programme was entirely self-funded.

Best Practice 2:

<u>Title of the Practice</u>: Publication of departmental wall magazines

<u>Objectives of the Practice</u>: The goal of this practice is to ensure quality teacher-student involvement and to bring out the inherent talents of the students. This practice aims to encourage the students to express and implement their innovative ideas and creativity, and to display them at a public forum.

The Context: It was felt that our students are so much engrossed in curricular activities, that as teachers we

felt that somewhere we fail to identify their hidden creative talents. As such the departmental wall magazines provides a suitable platform for display of their talents.

<u>The Practice</u>: The faculty members of the departments suggest the theme for preparing the wall magazine, along with the space for display. The students after discussing amongst themselves, selects the best possible theme related to their corresponding subjects. While preparing the same, participation of every student is ensured by the department with monitoring by the teachers during the preparation stage. The final output is then formally inaugurated selecting a suitable data or events. This is an annual practice.

<u>Evidence of Success</u>: This practice has been successful in involving the students in departmental activities. It has also led to the growth of departmental unity, integrity and developed a sense of we-feeling and co-operation amongst them. Initially few departments started this practice. Owing to its healthy outcome, several departments are presently having individual departmental wall magazines.

<u>Problems Encountered and Resources Required</u>: Since this practice is a departmental activity, every department has limited resources, and as such, at times it becomes difficult to meet the expenses for other departmental requirement. In many instances, the students themselves procure the stationery materials that are required for this purpose.
