Proceedings Students' Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC) meeting held on 14th October, 2023

An in-house committee meeting of the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee was held on 14th October, 2023, Saturday, at 2.30 pm, at the Conference Hall of Pragjyotish College. The meeting was presided over by the Chairperson of the committee Mr. Bishwajyoti Dev Mahanta. At the beginning of the meeting, the Chairperson read out the proceedings of the joint meeting between SGRC and Criterion -I hold on 1st June, 2023 and it was unanimously accepted.

The Chairperson then briefed the members of the committee about some anonymous letters found inside the Complain Box on 9th October, expressing grievances about irregularity of 3rd Semester Generic classes in Zoology Department. Mr. Nabadeep Das, and Dr. Deepali Baruah, members of SGRC, wanted to know about the contents of the letters. Chairperson read out the letters in the meeting and invited suggestions from its members. All the members present in the meeting expressed their opinions and after thorough discussion following resolutions were adopted in the meeting.

Resolution No-1:

Today's meeting has resolved to inform the Principal, about the anonymous letters found in the Complaint Box regarding alleged irregularity of the 3rd Semester Generic classes and to request the authority to verify the authenticity of such allegations.

Resolution No-2:

Today's meeting has resolved to request the Principal, about the non-availability of 'particular class room' for the 3rd Semester Generic classes for Zoology Department as has been stated in the letters.

Resolution No-3:

Today's meeting has resolved that as the letters dropped in the Complaint Box don't contain the names of the aggrieved students, follow-up steps taken by the SGRC cannot be communicated to any particular student(s).

After adoption of the above mentioned resolutions the Chairperson of SGRC expressed his thanks to the committee members and for their co-operation and valuable suggestions and announced the end of the meeting.

Resolution No-2:

Today's meeting resolved to inform the College Canteen Monitoring Committee regarding the grievances of the students reflected in the students' feedback collected by the IQAC and undertake appropriate measures for their redressal.

Resolution No-3:

Today's meeting resolved to request the authority to display the issues may be redressed by the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee for the students at a prominent place.

Resolution No-4:

Today's meeting resolved to request the authority to arrange an Orientation Programme for the students at the beginning of the new session to make them aware about different in-house committees and their functions.

Proceedings Students' Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC) meeting held on 2nd May, 2023

An in-house committee meeting of the Students' Grievance Redressal Committee was held on 2nd May, 2023, Tuesday, at 4.30 pm, at the Principal's chamber of Pragjyotish College. The meeting was presided over by the Chairperson of the committee Mr. Bishwajyoti Dev Mahanta. At the beginning of the meeting, the Chairperson briefed the newly appointed members of the committee about the latest UGC notification about redressing the grievances of the students issued on 11the April, 2023.

In his speech Dr. Manoj Kumar Mahanta, Principal, Pragjyotish College, said that as the new UGC notification has brought some changes in the formation of the SGRC as well as redressal procedures of the students in a higher educational institution, a new Students' Grievance Redressal Committee has been formed as per the guidelines of the notification. He also appealed the members present to remain active and supportive in redressing the grievances of the students.

Chairperson, Mr. B.D. Mahanta, then tabled the draft of the policy document of SGRC, Pragjyotish College for the discussion of its members. All the members of the committee took part in the deliberations that ensued and offered some valuable suggestions. After a thread bear discussions following resolutions were adopted in the meeting.

Resolution No-1:

Today's meeting has resolved to accept the draft policy document of the newly constituted Students' Grievance Redressal Committee of the college.

Resolution No-2:

Today's meeting has resolved to consider the grievance/grievances found in the Complaint/ Grievance Box submitted by any anonymous student(s). However, in such case(s), an enquiry is to be conducted at the initiative of the committee immediately after receiving such complaint(s) about its authenticity and take/suggest measure(s) accordingly.

<u>Resolution No-3</u>: Today's meeting has resolved to consider the following categories grievances of students in conformity with UGC's notification dated 11th April, 2023.

- (i) Admission;
- (ii) Prospectus;
- (iii) non-return of any document without valid reason;
- (iv) demand of undue money;
- (v) reservation of seats in admission to different category of students;

- (vi) scholarships or financial aid;
- (vii) internal examinations;
- (viii) students' amenities;
- (ix) evaluation procedure;
- (x) delay in, or denial of, the refund of fees as per law;
- discrimination of on the grounds of caste, community, sex, religion or disabilities categories;
- (xii) denial of quality education;
- (xiii) Harassment or victimization of a student;
- (xiv) Any action initiated/ taken contrary to the students, rules, regulations or guidelines of the institution or of UGC.

Resolution No-4:

Today's meeting has resolved to hold a joint meeting with Criterion-I of IQAC of the college which collects the feedback of the students on overall facilities and environment of the college to know about their complaints, grievances and suggestions which may help the smooth functioning of the committee.

After the adoption of the above mentioned resolutions, the Chairperson expressed his thanks and gratitude to all the members present in the meeting and announced its end.

The offline mechanism (Complaints box outside Principal Office) and Online mechanism (icc@pragjyotishcollege.ac.in) was taken into consideration while checking for complaints and grievances. A random survey was carried out among the students of the College to assess the awareness about the ICC mechanism and response. With student members in the Committee helping out, it was found that the current batches of students are well aware of the mechanisms for ICC and their functioning. The Committee found that no complaints were reported in, through both the mechanisms (online and offline). Therefore, the Committee is forwarding a satisfactory report in relation to ICC awareness among the students for the Session 2021-2022.

The College has re-constituted the Anti-Ragging and Discipline Maintenance Committee (earlier Anti-Ragging Central Committee) in the year 2022. The period of validity of the Committee is from 12-08-2022 to 11-08-2024 for a period of 2 years. The main objective of the Committee was to prevent the menace of ragging and maintain healthy inter-personal relations among the students of the college campus. Ragging is strictly forbidden in or outside the college campus. For this purpose, the Anti-Ragging and Discipline Maintenance Committee has been actively functioning. In the academic year, 2022-23 the college students were informed about Anti-ragging through the Prospectus. The members with some special invitees (faculty members) few monitoring teams were made to keep vigil inside the college campus to make the campus ragging free and maintenance of discipline.
