1832 - 1917

EB Tylor was an English anthropologist and also often regarded as the founder of modern anthropology. His primary goal of anthropological study was to develop a framework in which the diversity of culture could be explained and the diversity of origins understood according to the development of religious studies before developed a theory of a evolutionary relationship between "primitive" and "modern" cultures. His famous books are primitive culture (1871) and the origin of culture (1871).


JAMES GEORGE FRAZER

He was the first formally trained Indian anthropologist to study the impact of non-tribal cultures upon the ways of life of Indian tribes. Majumder was a historian and professor of Indian history. His contribution of physical anthropology consists mainly in the extensive anthropometric and serological surveys which he carried out among the tribes castes of the five Indian states of Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat and Bengal. Famous books - A tribe of transition (1937), The affairs of tribe (1950).




RUTH BENEDICT 1887 - 1948




