He was the first formally trained Indian anthropologist to study the impact of non tribal cultures upon the ways of life of Indian Tribes. Majumder was a historian and professor of Indian history. His contribution of physical anthropology consists mainly in the extensive anthropometric and serological surveys which he carried out among the tribes castes of the five Indian states of Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat and Bengal. Famous books - A Tribe of Transition (1937), The Affairs of Tribe (1950)

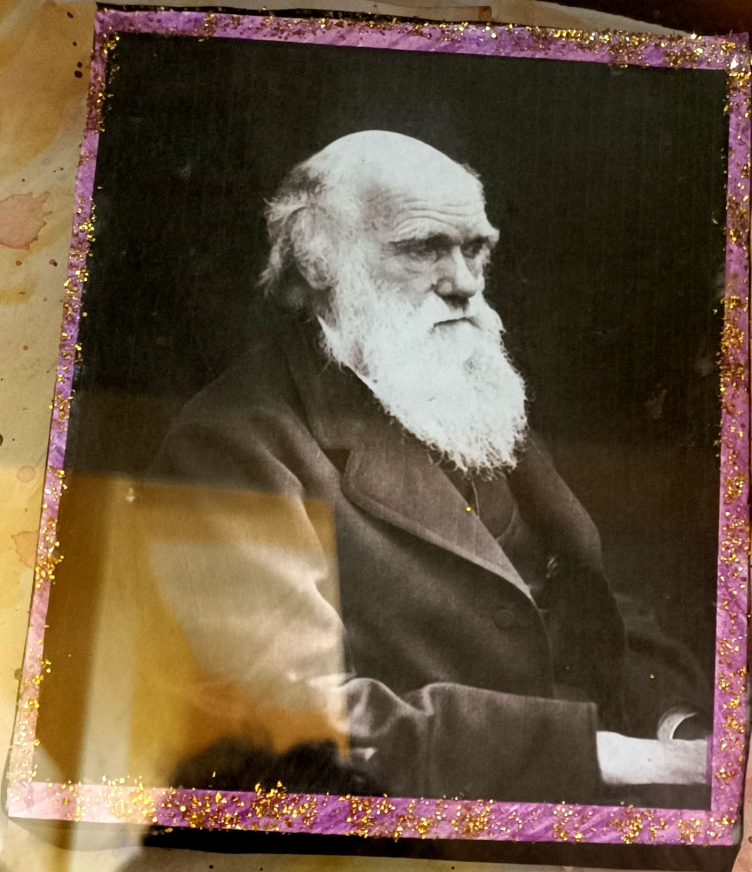

Benedict was an American anthropologist whose theories had profound influence on cultural anthropology, especially in the area of culture personality. Her major contribution to anthropology compares Zuni, Dobe and Rana Kintl cultures in order to demonstrate how small a portion of the possible range of human behaviour is incorporated into any one culture. In 1947 she was acknowledged as the outstanding anthropological association. Famous books are tales of the cochiti Indians 1931.

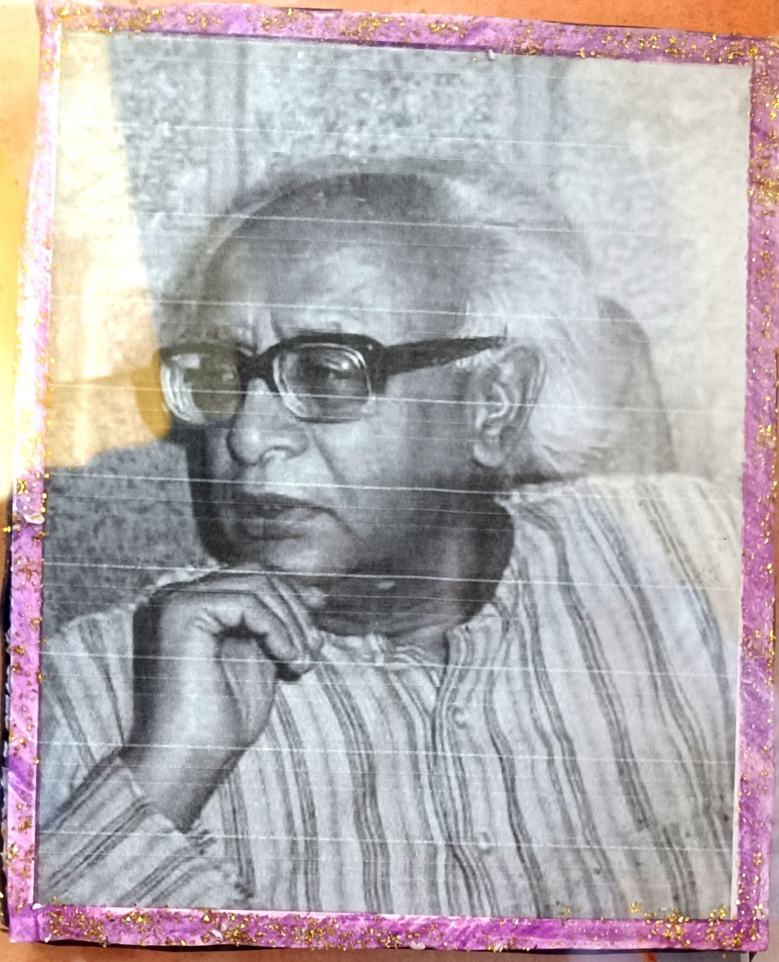
